DAN SAXON Dan Saxon has been writing and publishing since the early 1960's when he contributed to and published Poets at Le Metro. Dan's poems have been published in several magazines and anthologies including East Side Scene, American Poets 1960-1965 published by Anchor Doubleday, 1972 and In a Time of Revolution, Poems from our Third World, Random House, 1969. Magazines in which his poems appear include Bergen Poets Anthology #14, The Ever Dancing Muse, Sensations Magazine, Lunch, Passaic Review, University of Tampa Review, Intrepid, Kauri, Lines, Poets at Le Metro, Wormwood Review and others.
